CURRAWONGS

lay between two to four
spotted eggs and sit on them
for approximately 20 days.
Once hatched, juveniles are
greyish in colour.

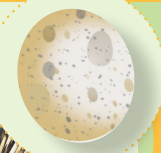
EMPEROR GUM MOTH

(*Opodiphthera eucalypti*) begins
its life cycle as eggs laid on eucalyptus
leaves. The eggs are small, round, and
pale green, which helps them blend in
with their surroundings.

SHORT BEAKED ECHIDNA

will lay one soft shell egg at a time. Each egg is approximately the same size as an Australian 5 cent piece (2cm). The egg will then hatch after around 10 days. Its baby is known as a Puggle.

EGG COUNT



DIAMOND PYTHON

can lay between 10-30 eggs in one clutch. These eggs will remain with the female python for 55-60 days before hatching.

SUPERB LYRE BIRD

generally only lay one egg, which hatches after 6 weeks of incubation. Once hatched the young Lyre Bird will live in the nest for the first 6-10 weeks.

THE EASTER BUNNY

comes once a year on the Easter long weekend. Overnight the Easter Bunny will leave colourful eggs, for people to find. These eggs can be identified by their bright colours and patterns, and are made of chocolate.
